Kilometer Long Oil Stain in Sava River

An oil stain was spotted in the Sava River near Lukovac Donji in Sisak Moslavina County on Tuesday morning, the Central Information Centre 112 reported. The stain was reported to be about one kilometer long and 15 meters wide.

The Chief State Water Inspectorate said that water experts and officials of the Croatian Power Supply Company and the Ina oil refinery from Sisak visited the site, but underlined that their leakage to the river was not oil polluted.

55% of Regulations Need to be Cut

1,451 regulations have a direct effect on the economy, while 55% of them need to be either eliminated or simplified.

That is the result, as well as recommendation of the HITROREZ project special unit, after nine months of analysis of nearly 11,000 forms and formal legal regulations stumping the economy.

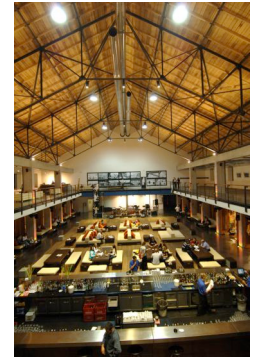

55% of Regulations Need to be Cut (continued...)

"We have proposed the elimination of 419 regulations, and simplification of 372 that are effecting the further development of the economy. Of those regulations to be eliminated, 55% of them contain 29% of the regulation that are represented in bylaw acts, ordinances and so on", said Vedran Antoljak, Hitrorez special unit coordinator.

Only 11 laws need to be eliminated, while the majority of regulations that are restricting the economy are of an inter-secting nature, meaning that they are linked to numerous business areas.

However, the elimination and simplification of regulations will be mostly conducted in the transport, agricultural, trade, and financial sectors.

Simplification of regulations will make for administrative savings of more than 1 billion kn yearly.

At their next meeting, the Government will accept the Hitrorez proposals.

After the end of this phase, the regulatory guillotine should move on to other areas.

According to first estimates, more than 4,500 regulations will be targeted for elimination – mainly in the civil sector, as well as an equal number brought by local administrations.

In addition to eliminating administrative barriers, the Hitrorez project should also result in the drafting in an electronic registry of regulations.

Reactions to President Tadic's war apology

Croatian President Stjepan Mesic stated that the apology from Serbian President, Boris Tadic to the Croatian people for the events of the recent past came "just in time".

In an interview for the Croatian television HRT, Serbian President, Boris Tadic made an apology regarding the war in the Nineties. "This is an apology to all Croats that were made unhappy in the name of my people. I am apologizing and assuming responsibility", said President Tadic.

Tadic stated on Sunday that the prerequisite for the development of relations in the Western Balkans was for everybody to apologize for the atrocities of the recent past.

"I started... I expect that the same treatment will be given to my compatriots from other state leaders", said Tadic, who participated in the regional energy summit in Zagreb.

The Serbian President added that he did not apologize in his own name, rather as an "institution", reminding that there have been similar examples of heads of state apologizing for the misdeeds of their people in the past.

REACTIONS IN SERBIA

The majority of the Serbian public supported Tadic's apology to Croatia.

The Serbian Radical Party, the party of charged war criminal, Vojislav Seselj, as well as the Serbian Socialist Party, party of former Serbian dictator, Slobodan Milosevic, expectedly opposed the apology, accusing Tadic of treason.

Human rights activists were especially supportive of the sentence in which Tadic assumed responsibility.
